

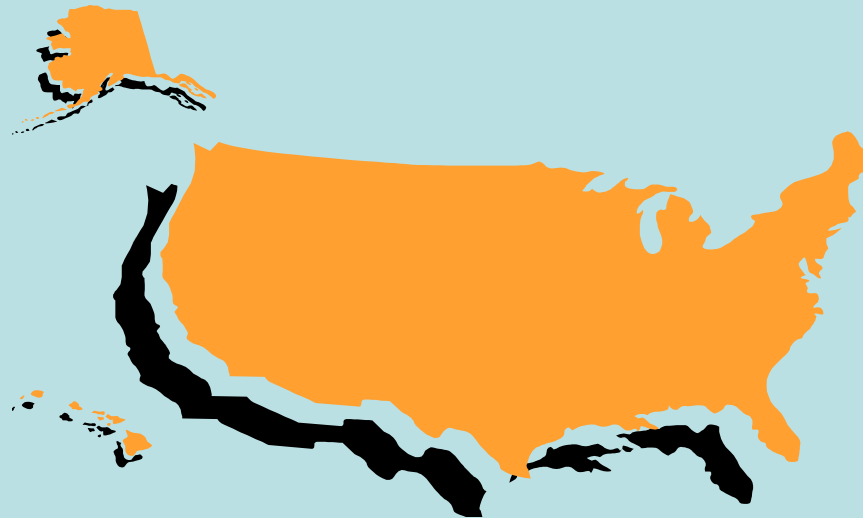

AHRQ's Mission

Improve the quality, safety, efficiency and effectiveness of health care for all Americans



Information from AHRQ's research helps people make more informed decisions and improve the quality of health care services.



HHS and AHRQ

- We are:
 - Part of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
 - Health Services Research arm – access to health care, costs and results
 - The lead Federal agency on health care quality, costs, outcomes and patient safety
- We are not:
 - A policy-making agency
 - A regulatory agency



AHRQ's Research Focus

- Patient-centered, not disease-specific
- Dual focus – Services + Delivery Systems
- Cost-effectiveness – trade-offs between quality, outcomes, access, and costs
- Effectiveness research focuses on actual daily practice, not ideal situations (efficacy)



AHRQ's Principal Responsibilities

- Research which develops evidence-based information on health care outcomes, quality, safety, cost, use and access
- Ensure information is disseminated rapidly, widely, readily usable form



AHRQ GOAL: Accelerate the Diffusion and Uptake of Innovations

- Concept – increase implementation of health care improvement strategies in the U.S.
- Strategy – provide a resource that supports decision-making on the potential adoption and implementation of service innovations
- Result – in September 2006 – AHRQ awards contract to develop the Innovations Clearinghouse

Featured Topic - Pressure Ulcers



Pressure ulcers are a common problem across health care settings. The incidence of pressure ulcers varies by clinical setting: 0.4% to 38.0% for hospitals, 2.2% to 23.9% for long-term care, and 0% to 17% for home care, according to a 2003 article published in the *Journal of the American Medical Association*.

The estimated cost to treat a pressure ulcer is between \$500 and \$40,000. Yet, pressure ulcers can be managed and prevented.

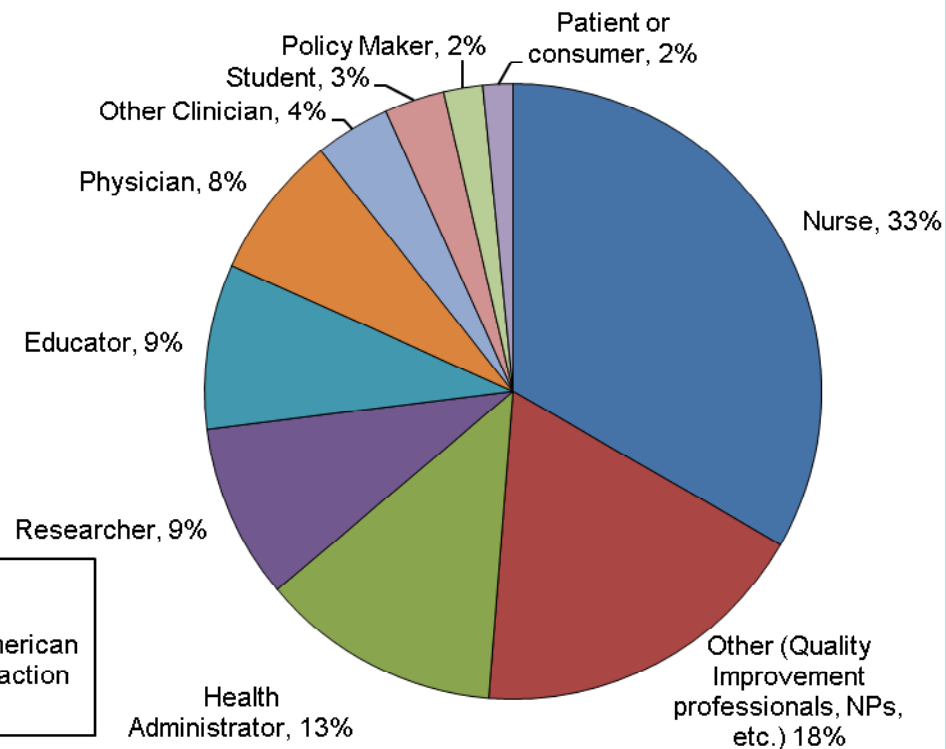


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Innovations Exchange Users by Role
